

Traffic Snapshot

- February 2024 total passenger movements for MAHB network of airports was remarkably high, recording 11.0 million passengers, despite February shorter days.
- The high passenger volume was partly driven by year end school holidays, China's Spring Festival, new airlines, additional frequencies, Chinese New Year festive seasons, Routes Asia events in Langkawi, driving February 2024 passengers and achieving a growth for the first time since March 2020 at 3.3% against a lower base in February 2019.
- It is encouraging to note that the international passenger movements of 5.8 million was the highest movements to-date since February 2020 and on par with the average passenger movements in the 2H19.
- Domestic passenger numbers registered 5.2 million, reaching the highest recovery rate of 94.5% over 2019 February and surpassing December 2023 volume.
- Similarly, airports in Malaysia recorded new highs registering 7.8 million total passengers, the highest volume for a month since February 2020 with 95.8% recovery rate over 2019 levels.
- February movements have also exceeded 2019 average daily passengers between 1% to 10% on seven separate occasions for the first time since the pandemic outbreak in 2020.
- The encouraging traffic is partly driven by new airline operations, Chinese New Year festive seasons, airlines' route resumption and expansion, visa exemptions for China and India and the one-month long school holidays.
- Remarkably the international passenger movements surpassed December peak month traffic signifying traffic continual recovery and trailing pre-COVID trends. Equally, the domestic sector was encouraging, recording 3.8million passengers at 94.9% recovery rate over 2019 levels.
- Istanbul SAW traffic continued to be buoyant with February 2024 27.4% growth over 2019 levels and exceeding January 2024 passengers by 0.2% at 3.2million passengers. International continues to drive growth, with a remarkable 86.0% growth over February 2019 and 31.9% over February 2023.

Overview of traffic

February 2024 passenger movements for the MAHB network of airports showed an unusually strong growth momentum, recording 11 million passengers despite February shorter days and exceeding February 2019 levels by 3.3%. The robust growth was driven by a combination of positive dynamics such as the one-month year end school holidays, the eight-day Chinese Spring Festival season, 30 days visa exemptions for China and India, new airlines, additional frequencies, Chinese New Year festive and Routes Asia event in Langkawi. Remarkably, the international passenger movements recorded new highs exceeding 5 million marks for the second consecutive month at 5.8million passengers, a double-digit increase of 12.8% over February 2019. Domestic passenger movements were equally encouraging, recording 5.2million passengers reaching a high recovery rate of 94.5%.

Correspondingly, traffic at airports in Malaysia continue to show resilience recording new highs of 7.8million passengers, reaching more than 90% recovery rate for the first time at 95.8%. It is noteworthy to note that the daily average international passenger movements occasionally exceeded February 2019 on seven separate days between 1% to 10%. There has been an increase in passengers from Mainland China and India following the introduction of the 30 days visa-free entry from 1 December 2023, with both sectors reaching 86% and 90% respectively over 2019 levels. Domestic sector fared well, recording 3.8 million passenger movements reaching 94.8% of February 2019 levels, marking the highest recovery rate since the pandemic outbreak. The average load factor reached more than 80% at 82.9%, indicating traffic is on the path towards normalisation, particularly during months with festive seasons and school holidays, which tend to be peak months.

The robust growth in traffic was also driven by airline route expansions, new airlines and routes resumption. KL International Airport (KUL) welcomed Turkmenistan Airlines with twice weekly frequencies from Ashgabat expanding Central Asian connectivity. Loong Air commenced operations to Hangzhou with thrice-weekly frequencies starting 1st February. Batik Air Malaysia's additional operations from KUL to Tawau, with daily services, and to Kota Bharu and Sibu, with twice weekly services, have further stimulated growth in domestic passenger movements and expanding the airline's international network across Asia and Europe, introducing service to six new city pairs, namely Kaohsiung, Dayong, and Batam with three flights per week, and SAW, Kunming, and Zhengzhou with four flights per week, respectively. In addition, AirAsia recommenced Lombok service from KUL with three weekly frequencies after suspending the service in May 2019, and in addition introduced Thiruvananthapuram with four weekly frequencies, increasing the airlines' expansion to India. Kota Kinabalu International Airport welcomed direct flights from Jakarta operated by Indonesia AirAsia and Shanghai PuDong by AirAsia, with thrice weekly frequencies respectively. Penang and Langkawi International Airport also welcomed Flydubai with daily service to open new outward streams of leisure travel from Dubai.

Istanbul Sabiha Gökçen International Airport (SAW) traffic continued to be buoyant, recording 3.2 million passenger movements, surpassing pre-pandemic levels by 27.4%, marking the highest recovery rate to-date. International sector, the main driver for growth, surpassed 2019 levels with a remarkable 86.0% growth, while the domestic passenger movements recorded 1.5million passengers, reaching 93.4% of 2019 levels. In a move to bolster connectivity between KUL and SAW, Batik Air expanded its service offerings with the introduction of four weekly frequencies for this route. This expansion not only enhances the air link between Malaysia and Türkiye but also establishes SAW's longest route and first connectivity to the Far East.

In the latest February 2024 revision, the Airport Council International (ACI) indicated that the Asia Pacific Region is expected to surpass 2019 levels by 3% for the first time since COVID-19, by the end of 2024. ACI also forecasted that the global passenger numbers for 2024 would surpass 2019 by 6% and increase by 12% compared to 2023.
