

Traffic snapshot

- MAHB's network of airports continued to gain traction in May 2022, recording 7.1million passenger movements, surpassing the 7-million mark for the first time in two years.
- Both Malaysia and Istanbul SGIA recorded the highest passenger volume for the year, with encouraging daily traffic momentum fuelled by the Aidilfitri celebrations in the first week of May, the Sabah and Sarawak harvest festival of Kaamatan and Gawai at the end of May and the onset of summer holidays in mid-May.
- Malaysia's domestic sector continue to recover as a result of an uplift of the interstate travel ban from 11 October 2021 and was further stimulated by inter-domestic travel between airports to international destinations with the reopening of borders on 1 April 2022. Domestic passenger movements exceeded 3million passengers (3.5million) for the first time since February 2020.
- International passenger movements reached 1million for the first time since March 2020, recording more than 50% growth over April 2022.
- Istanbul SGIA international sector shows traffic reaching normalisation with passenger movements exceeding pre-COVID levels in May, attributed by leisure traffic, airlines route and capacity expansion. Domestic passenger movements reached 79% of pre-COVID traffic while international traffic recorded the highest volume to-date in 2022, reaching 1.2million passengers.
- Traffic trajectory is trending positively towards pre-COVID level, nevertheless, MAHB will
 continue to monitor closely the developments on the global economic front and aviation
 industry.

Overview of traffic

May 2022 traffic performance for the total MAHB network of airport shows traffic gaining traction, recording the highest passenger movements to-date surpassing the 7-million mark for the first time in two years. Both international and domestic passenger movements equally recorded the highest traffic for this year.

International passenger movements in Malaysia were encouraging, reaching 1million volume in May 2022 in just over a month after the reopening of borders. Lanmei Airlines, a new scheduled airline at KL International Airport, commenced operation on 28 May with one weekly frequency

and plans to subsequently increase to 7 times weekly. IndiGo Airlines, Jin Air, Thai Smile Airways, Royal Brunei and Philippine AirAsia have resumed operations in May. AirAsia, Himalaya Airlines, Indonesia AirAsia, Jetstar Asia, Oman Air, Saudi Arabian Airlines, Scoot Airlines, Thai Airways, US Bangla, Vietjet and Vietnam Airlines have also increased frequencies, contributing to an additional 209 weekly frequencies in May.

Domestic passenger movements were equally encouraging, reaching over 3million passengers, or 91% of pre-COVID levels. The growth was fuelled by Aidilfitri celebrations in the early weeks of May and, Sabah and Sarawak's harvest festival season celebrations towards the end of May. The traffic momentum gained in May continued into June with an 11% increase in daily average passenger movements to 163,000.

Istanbul SGIA passenger movements continued to show strong growth, driven by leisure traffic, airlines route and capacity expansion. International passenger movements recorded the highest volume to-date in 2022, recording 1.2million passengers. Anadolujet and Pegasus commenced new services to Milan-Bergamo and Helsinki with daily and 4 times weekly flights on 16 and 26 May respectively.
